




Mechanics of Rating Process


Tier 1 to Tier 2

Qualifications for Eligibility

1. Complete workbook satisfactorily
2. Score $\geq 75\%$ on current season rules test
3. On court rating with score $\geq 75\%$

Member in Good Standing—Definition

75% attendance at previous year’s in-sport meetings.
 Certified Official: Pass WOA clinic and Rules Test by current season deadline

Fees 1.Observation: Prior to rating: \$50 2.Rating: All evening earnings + \$50		
Raters Working partner and two off -court raters		

Tier 2 to Tier 3

Qualifications for Eligibility

1. Rated Tier 2 Official for at least one High School season.
2. Officiated a minimum of 12 High School Varsity matches as a Tier 2.
3. Official observation, preceding rating session
4. Score $\geq 85\%$ on current season rules test
5. On court rating with score $\geq 85\%$

Advancements to the next level are stepping stones to progress. Officials work at least one full season after acquiring rating at the new level before progressing to the next level (i.e. minimum of 12 varsity matches, cumulative). Working with all levels of officials, participating in pre-game and post-game review for the assigned match by both receiving and giving constructive feedback at conclusion of matches, a willingness to accept a broad array of assignments and continued Member in Good Standing status(see definition) are some of the expectations held for those maintaining status quo in GSVO.

All officials must notify the Ratings Chair on or before the last meeting of the current Fall season for consideration for advancement to the next rating level the following Fall Season.
